

1922 Sunday 27
nearly all the Indians arrived
for treaty. Rainfall nearly all
last night and early this morning

Monday 28
Treaty paid the Indians today
self very busy getting help
in store

Tuesday 29
Weather fine self very busy
most of the Indians left for home
after buying their supplies

Wednesday 30
The Messengers arrived from Pease Point
bringing Jim McLean and an Inspector
Anderson to Banister and a few
others and a lot of freight for here and
N Hope. on a number of the packers
breaking down they unloaded all
the freight and returned to Pease
Crossing they left trucks and
took to the trail and party and
Horn on Board. self & John
hauled up freight

Thursday 31
self & John hauled freight and
found it was broken & Dr. Banister
left for the Indian Reserve by
Magnum & the Indians
started to rain about 7 PM
and snow for about 2 or 3 hours
